The Lord wants everyone to be an active member in the church, to serve God, people and his/her own eternal life.

The Lord Jesus Christ taught us that ministry is a MUST for our salvation, as well as a blessing and an honor. In Matthew 25: 14 - 30, He mentioned the parable of the talents which indicated that everyone has 5 or 2 or at least 1 talent. You have to invest your Godgiven talents and win, or else you will lose them and be thrown into the outer darkness. There is no place for idle people in the kingdom of God.

Many people say, "we do not know how to serve. What kinds of services are there that a layperson can do? Or, no one asked us!" In this article, I am telling you that the Lord Jesus is inviting you to start; He promised a great reward, here and in heaven (Matt. 20 & 25). St. Paul also says, "Therefore, my beloved brethren, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that your labor is not in vain in the Lord." (1 Cor. 15:58).

You will see here, a long list of services available to you, choose whatever fits your talents and time, circle one or more, and arrange with the priests of the church and be committed to it.

#### Senior Citizens:

- 1. Drive a senior to Sunday (or Wednesday or Friday) Liturgy or Vespers.
- 2. Drive a senior to and back physician's office or a pharmacy.
- 3. Give a senior a drive to a super market, store or a bank.
- 4. Accompany a senior to a park or a restaurant.
- 5. Visit a senior at home or in a hospital, or a nursing home.

# Women's services (Marthas):

- 6. Emergency services (e.g., Care for children, prepare a meal and doing light housework).
- 7. Help with telephone calls (telephone tree: every lady calls 10 friends or neighbors in urgent events).
- 8. Prepare a dish for a funeral luncheon.
- 9. Consolation service.
- 10. Baby sitting.
- 11. Help serve or cleanup in church.
- 12. In children's nursery.
- 13. Cafeteria work.

- 14. Observing order and cleanliness in the church.
- 15. Help in kitchen, crafts and festivals.
- 16. Serving in women's meetings.
- 17. Beautifying the church, decorating and the service of flowers and roses.
- 18. Translation services.
- 19. Welcoming church guests.
- 20. Helping in weddings, women and girls' baptism and communion.
- 21. Secretarial works, computer & typing.
- 22. First aid services.
  - 23. Choir, music, arts.
  - 24. Church Library and bookstore.
  - 25. Services of charitable works like Tabitha (Acts 9:39-
  - 41), Lydia in prayer meetings (Acts 16); Priscilla and the mother of Rufus in guidance and hospitality (Acts 18:26; Rom. 16:13).

# Sunday School & Children's Needs:

- 26. Teaching.
- 27. Pictures, Video and audiovisuals.
- 28. Bringing the children to church if their parents are not coming.
- 29. Children's camps and picnics.
- 30. Serving the children in the crying room.
- 31. Distributing gifts to the children in the Feasts of Christmas, Easter, Halloween and birthdays.
- 32. Visiting Sunday school children.
- 33. The Summer Club.
- 34. Children's library.

#### **Youth Services:**

- 35. Deacons services.

- 48. Writing or translating articles.
- 49. Supervising the youth' summer club, spirituality and sports.
- 50. Sending greeting cards and inquiring in case of absence.
- 51. Telephone recording messages.
  - 52. Welcoming new youth and taking their addresses and phone numbers.
  - 53. Teaching in Sunday school classes.
  - 54. Choir, hymns and musical instruments.
  - 55. Organizing or directing Youth celebrations and plays.
  - 56. Taking pictures in important occasions.
  - 57. Recording sermons and Bible studies.
  - 58. Copying documents and articles.

### Serving the Needy:

- 70. Provide shelter, food, clothes, furniture, blankets to the needy and toys, for poor children.
- 71. Searching for work to them.
- 72. Helping them financially and by all means, to stand on their feet.
- 73. Adopting a needy family here or in Egypt or Africa.

#### Hospitality:

- 74. Serve coffee, tea and doughnuts.
- 75. Purchase or maintain flowers.
- 76. Entertain strangers & guests.

#### Stewardship:

- 77. Willing to serve in financial, legal or personal areas.
- 78. Willing to serve in maintenance, management for church facilities.
- 79. Cleaning and polishing vessels.
- √ 80. Washing towels, dry-cleaning vestments and ironing altar covers and linens.
  - 81. Vacuuming the church carpet.
  - 82. Church bulletin board.
  - 83. Visiting prisons.
  - 84. Baking the holy bread (Korban).
  - 85. Providing Bibles, Prayer books, icons, candles, oil for the candles, incense, coverings of the altar, curtains, the reading books, the altar vessels, wine, flower and other ministry supplies.
  - 86. Arranging church trips.
  - 87. Providing bathroom supplies, towels, toilet paper, soap and detergents.

#### **Grounds Beautification committee:**

- 88. Landscaping.
- 89. Cutting the lawn.
- 90. Keeping order and calmness.
- 91. Cleaning the premises...
- 92. Caring for the trees and flowers.

Weddings, Baptisms & funerals:

- 93. Deacons' services needed.
- 94. Rehearsals.
- 95. Church decoration.
- 96. Sewing Baptismal garments.

# **Church Library & Bookstore:**

- 97. Publicity, advertising and printing labels.
- 98. Completing the shortage in books, gifts, crosses, magazines, pictures, cassettes, videos and CDs.
- 99. Recording, audio and visual sermons in feasts, festivals and important activities
- 100. Postal services and parcels.
- 101. Catalogue & Inventory work.

#### Lectors:

- 102. Training on reading the liturgical Scriptures correctly.
- 103. Presentations for the youth and the children.
- 104. Proclaiming the word of God and Bible Study.
